

Reed All About It: Taipei Taiwan

你好

Greetings from the Greater Taipei Church of Christ in Taiwan! The Champions team has settled in and has started teaching English Bible classes. Everyone is doing a great job teaching. We have managed to see a few sights this past Saturday and Sunday. On Saturday we went to the top of the Taipei 101 building which is the 5th tallest building in the world. Next we visited the National Palace Museum. This is a must see attraction containing many ancient Chinese artifacts. There was a special exhibit visiting from China. This exhibit contained several Terracotta Warriors and many of their artifacts. On Sunday we visited the Chiang Kai-Shek Memorial Hall and a botanical garden containing many lotus plants that were in bloom. Along the way we stopped for some "pearl tea" and wrapped up the

day with a great dinner. Lotus, who visited our church a few years ago, hosted our fun afternoon in Taipei.

We started teaching students on Monday; it is great to see some of the folks I taught last year. We had a couple of young children come for lessons. This brought the idea of hosting a Vacation Bible School here next year. More to come later on this idea. It is wonderful to see the Champions team learn about the Taiwanese culture from the students.

On Tuesday we had time to visit a Buddhist temple. This temple was also Taoist place of worship. The temple was called Longshan Temple and is very old and ornate. There were many people worshiping in the temple. They were burning incense and offering food to the Buddha that best meets their needs. People also were casting lots in order to help them make a decision about an important life dilemma. This visit helped the mission team better understand the religious background of some of the Taiwanese people. The reality is most Taiwanese who claim to be Buddhist are only so in name and not practice. Perhaps they have a family background in a religion, but most do not practice their faith

Christianity with an emphasis on Christ has a great appeal to the citizens of Taiwan. The difficult part is convincing a believer to commit themselves to Christ in baptism. From the Taiwanese perspective this conversion indicates a separation from their family. We have already encountered a few students who are at this point. Please pray for us as we continue our work in Taiwan.

Howdy, first I would like to say THANK YOU to this congregation for giving me the wonderful opportunity to be the youth intern this summer! I have enjoyed the summer very much and have loved every day I have spent here. The church family here has been such a blessing to me in how loving and welcoming you all are. I would also like to say a special thank you to David and Darlene Bounds for opening their home to me and being an exciting family to live with.

This summer had many firsts for me, and although I was hired to help the youth group grow, I also feel as if I have learned a lot about ministry and youth in general. I taught my first Bible class to the junior high students on Wednesday nights. We discussed the Bible as a whole, how it got here, why it is here, and why it is The

Holy Book. I hope the students were able to come away learning something; even I discovered things I did not know before and that made me excited to teach each week.

Not many people can say they have climbed a 14,000 foot mountain before, but now there are a number of us who can. This was a huge accomplishment to those of us who went. I have never been surrounded by God's beauty and power like I was that week on the mountain.

VBS also gave me many firsts -- a pie thrown in my face, my hair and eyes spray painted. There was one constant theme that came with each event though; it was not the activity or occasion that made my summer

one of the best ones I have had, but the people who have been a part of it. This youth group is truly special, and every time I saw one of its members, I was reminded of Jesus. I was able to see our Lord's love through each individual in the youth group, and that has made this summer special. John's Jogs:

Naomi and Ruth is one of the most astounding friendships of all history. This friendship ultimately has an effect of tremendous proportions on the history of mankind.

In the time of the Judges, Israel has a severe famine. A man of Bethlehem in Judea named Elimelech, his wife Naomi and two sons, Mahlon and Kilion, went to live in Moab. Moab was a nation descended from the son of the unholy relationship of Lot and his oldest daughter. While in Moab the two sons married local girls. Kilion married Orpha and Mahlon married Ruth. Within a ten year period all three men died leaving behind widows without children. In this male dominated society, women without a father, husband or son to care for them could quickly become destitute; they had few rights.

Naomi, hearing that the famine in Judah had ended, decided to return to her homeland. So Naomi urged Ruth and Orpha each to return to their mother's home and begin looking for another husband. Initially they both rejected the idea, but after Naomi reasoned with them further, Orpha agreed to return. She left with a tearful good-bye. We are now ready to see the most astounding commitment: Ruth absolutely refused to leave Naomi when she replied, "Do not urge me to leave you or to turn back from you. Where you go I will

go, and where you stay I will stay. Your people will be my people and your God my God. Where you die I will die, and there I will be buried. May the Lord deal with me, be it ever so severely, if anything but death separates you and me." Can you think of any stronger statement of commitment? And this from a daughter-in-law to a mother-in-law. Talk about a FRIEND!

When the two women reached Bethlehem, the entire town was moved with sympathy for Naomi and no doubt with admiration for Ruth's unfailing loyalty toward her aging motherin-law. According to the Mosaic Law, the poor are allowed to collect any crops that were missed during the first pass of the reapers.

Fortunately, she chose the field of Boaz. This man had heard how Ruth had refused to abandon Naomi, and he took an immediate liking to her. He even left orders that the workers leave extra grain for her and that the young men not bother her. When she returned and reported what happened, Naomi was elated. Naomi explained that Boaz was not just a friendly neighbor, but one of their nearest kin. The Law of Moses obliged a man to marry his brother's widow to produce children to carry on the dead brother's family name and to claim the deceased man's property. Apparently, the rule could be extended to include

relatives other than brothers.

When wise old Naomi saw that Boaz had taken favorable notice of Ruth, she decided that it was time to see if a marriage could be arranged. Actually Ruth had a certain legal claim on Boaz as a near kinsman to her dead husband. Boaz appears to be really impressed by her commitment to raise up children to her dead husband's inheritance rather than going after younger men whether rich or poor.

So, with the blessing of the people, Boaz took Ruth to be his wife. She bore him a son, Obed, who became the grandfather of King David. In one of the final scenes of the book Naomi holds her grandson on her lap and cares for him. Years later JESUS, a descendant of Obed, was born in Bethlehem; He is described as one who gives: "LIFE FOR ALL MEN." (Romans 5:18). Matthew's genealogy of Jesus lists only four women, and Ruth is one of them. Jews today still honor Ruth by rereading her story during the annual "Feast of Weeks" that marks the end of grain harvest.

Because of the love, loyalty and commitment Ruth had, without ever knowing it, she mothered a host of kings and ultimately the King of Kings, the Savior of the world. A JUST REWARD FOR A FAITHFUL FRIEND!!
